

# OTW SAFETY CASE STUDY: GOLDEN SPIKE FOUNDATION

OTW, as mandated by the **National Park Services**, was entrusted with the responsibility to oversee a series of tasks for the **Golden Spike Foundation** in the state of Utah. The scope of our services included meticulous planning and logistics for a seven-day site set-up and dismantling process in a location which posed its own set of challenges due to its remoteness.



The project was comprehensive and encompassed a range of responsibilities. We were in charge of **permitting and mapping**, an intricate process that involved obtaining necessary approvals and creating detailed maps to facilitate smooth operations. We also handled **logistics planning**, which required us to **manage site services, equipment, and personnel** effectively.

In addition, we were responsible for **ADA planning**, ensuring that the event was accessible to all, regardless of physical ability. We also developed an **emergency procedures plan**, a critical component to ensure safety and security during the event. The project also included **site set and strike**, the physical implementation of setting up and taking down the event.

Over the course of four months, we led a coordinated effort with multiple state and local agencies. This included the UT Department of Heritage & Museums, Bear River County Health Department, Department of Interior NPS, ATT Military Services Communications, as well as State and Local Police and Fire Departments.

**Our collaborative efforts culminated in the successful execution of an event that was attended by over 10,000 individuals, reflecting our capacity to manage large-scale events effectively.**
